RUGBY

It has been a hard-fought couple of weeks on the rugby fields with our boys showing immense grit:

- vs Hoërskool Delmas (Sat 23 May): Good rugby was played by both sides, but Delmas walked away with the honours. Out of 5 games played, the Blues secured 2 wins, 1 draw, and 2 losses.
- vs Hoërskool Stoffberg (Sat 30 May): A fast and furious day of traditional schoolboy rugby was experienced. Across 5 games, we suffered 4 losses, but our resilient 1st Team managed a well-earned draw.
- vs Birchleigh High School (Fri 5 June): It was a hard, cold afternoon of rugby at home. Five games were played, and a special shoutout goes to our U16 boys who secured the lone victory of the day with a fantastic 26-12 win!

NETBALL

Our netball girls have been exceptionally busy on the courts, racking up excellent results:

- vs Hoërskool Delmas (Sat 23 May): This was a fantastic away friendly fixture. Our girls dominated, playing 8 games and winning 6, with the 1st Team taking a convincing 28-17 victory.
- vs St Dunstan's (Tue 26 May): An away league fixture producing 10 tightly contested matches (we won 4, drew 1, lost 5). The 1st Team fought hard for a 30-30 draw.
- vs Hoërskool Kempton Park (Thu 28 May): It was a tough day at the office against clinical opposition. Across 15 matches, the girls fought hard but walked away with 13 losses and 2 draws.

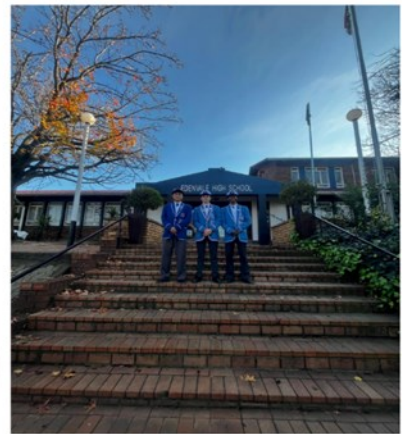



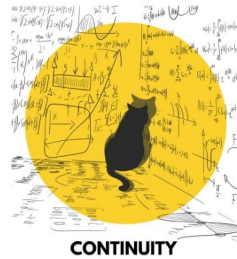
