

REPORTS: These will be sent by email on 14 December.


MY SCHOOL CARD

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO PARENTS

EXAM ARRANGEMENTS AND RULES NOVEMBER 2022

1. ABSENTEEISM

- Learners must attend school for all timetabled sessions.
- Any pupil who misses an exam must produce a doctor's certificate to cover the absence. Failure to comply with this ruling will result in a mark of 0%.
- Should there be a valid reason not related to health (e.g. a funeral), parents are requested to
 contact the Headmaster in writing to arrange leave of absence for the pupil. Pupils will not be
 allowed to write an exam on another day.

2. TIMES

- NO exam will be written except at the designated time.
- Pupils must be at school, and seated in the exam centre, for the duration of the session.
- Pupils are to be seated 15 minutes before the start of the session to allow for administrative duties.
- Pupils who are late will not be admitted to the exam room during the first 10 minutes or during the handing out of papers.
- Latecomers are to go to the front office to collect a late note. This note is to be given to the
 invigilator. No special consideration will be granted to latecomers in respect of time for the exam.

3. UNIFORM

• Full school uniform is to be worn to school at all times. Normal regulations will apply to hair, nails, jewellery, shoes etc. Learners will receive 5 demerits for any uniform default.

4. BEHAVIOUR

- Pupils ensure that you have NOTHING with you in the exam centre that could incriminate you in ANY way. This includes cell phones, ipods, MP3 players etc.
- These will be confiscated and must be collected by parents only.
- If a pupil is caught with a cell phone in an exam venue, it will be treated as cheating. The pupil will receive 15 demerits.
- Should a pupil be caught cheating, the Education Department policy requires that all written scripts be removed. The candidate may then re-write the test in the time that remains (even if it is only 10 minutes). The matter will then be investigated by the Headmaster.
- There is to be no communication of ANY kind once the exam process has been started i.e. from the handing out of the first paper, until the last paper has been handed in.
- No chewing, eating, drinking or tippex allowed in exam centres.
- All cell phones must still be handed in at the front office and are NOT allowed in the exam centres.
- No games of any sort are permissible on the sports fields during the exam period, including break and after school.
- Pupils may not leave the school property in between sessions.
- Pupils must leave the school property when they have finished writing for the day.

5. PUPILS

- Make sure, the night before, that you have everything you need for a specific test the next
- day as no borrowing will be allowed e.g. Geography and Maths instruments, colour pens/pencils, ruler, eraser, calculator,
- Bring an extra pen to school!!
- Write only in blue or black.
- Never use any red pen on your answer script.
- All stationery must be in a see-through plastic bag.




